And last but most certainly not least, we are honored to have our guest artist Leone Buyse present a class "Approaching Mozart with Confidence" as well as a general master class and a recital with Jane Garvin, Roma Kanasara and Catherine Ramirez. We would like especially to thank Catherine Ramirez for bringing Leone Buyse to Minnesota. We are very grateful for the collaboration with St. Olaf College in Ms. Buyse's presence at Flute Fest 2011. LEONE BUYSE

Guest Artist for Flute Fest 2011

LEONE BUYSE is the Joseph and Ida Kirkland Mullen Professor of Flute at Rice University's Shepherd School of Music. In 1993 she relinquished her position with the Boston Symphony Orchestra to pursue a more active teaching and solo career after 22 years as an orchestral musician. Acting principal flutist of the BSO during her last three years in Boston, she was invited by Seiji Ozawa to join the orchestra in 1983 as assistant principal flutist and principal flutist of the Boston Pops. Previously she served as assistant principal flutist of the San Francisco Symphony and played solo piccolo and second flute with the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra.

The only American finalist in the 1969 Geneva International Flute Competition, Ms. Buyse has appeared as soloist with l'Orchestre de la Suisse Romande, the Boston Symphony, the Boston Pops, the San Francisco Symphony, the Utah Symphony, the Rochester Philharmonic, and the New Hampshire Music Festival, of which she was principal flutist for ten years. She has performed with the Boston Symphony Chamber Players throughout Europe and Japan, with the Tokyo, Juilliard, Brentano, and Muir String Quartets, the Boston Musica Viva, Da Camera of Houston, and in recital with Jessye Norman and Yo-Yo Ma. Ms. Buyse has also been a guest artist on the National Arts Centre Orchestra's chamber series in Ottawa. Summer festival appearances include Aspen, Sarasota, Norfolk, Orcas Island, Domaine Forget (Quebec), ARIA International Summer Academy, the Ithaca Flute Institute, Youth Orchestra of the Americas, Sitka, Maui, Steamboat Springs, Strings in the Mountains, the Lake Placid Institute, and the Park City International Festival in Utah. With her husband, clarinetist Michael Webster, she performs in the Webster Trio and the Buyse-Webster Duo.

Widely renowned as an educator, Ms. Buyse has taught at the University of Michigan, the New England Conservatory, Boston University, the Tanglewood Music Center, the Boston University Tanglewood Institute, and as a visiting associate professor at the Eastman School of Music. Her students hold positions in many major orchestras, including the symphony orchestras of Cleveland, San Francisco, St. Louis, Houston, Kansas City, Syracuse, and San Diego, the Minnesota Orchestra, the Rochester Philharmonic, the Colorado Symphony, the New Zealand Symphony, the Singapore Symphony, and the Adelaide Symphony. Others are professors at such schools as the University of Texas at Austin, the University of Colorado at Boulder, Arizona State, the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Memorial University (St. John's, Newfoundland), Ball State University (Muncie, IN) and San Diego State.

Ms. Buyse has presented recitals and master classes at universities, conservatories and festivals across the United States, as well as in Canada, France, the Netherlands, Portugal, Japan, Australia, New Zealand, Mexico, and Brazil. She may be heard as solo flutist on numerous recordings of the Boston Symphony, Boston Pops and the San Francisco Symphony for the Philips, Deutsche Grammophon, RCA Victor, and Sony Classical labels. Her solo and chamber music recordings are available on the Crystal, Boston Records, CRI, Centaur, Hyperion, Elektra/Nonesuch, Equilibrium, Danacord, and Nami/Live Notes labels.

A native of Ithaca, New York, Ms. Buyse graduated with distinction from the Eastman School of Music, where she was a student of Joseph Mariano. Awarded a Fulbright grant, she subsequently studied in France with Michel Debost, Jean-Pierre Rampal, and Marcel Moyse. Also an accomplished pianist, she served for two years as accompanist at Rampal's summer master classes in Nice, France. An active member of the National Flute Association, she has served on the Board of Directors and as program chair for the 1987 convention in St. Louis, an event attended by more than 2200 flutists. She has been a featured soloist at NFA conventions in Boston, New York, Philadelphia, Washington, Chicago, Columbus, San Diego and Anaheim.

During the 2010 convention in Anaheim she was honored with a Lifetime Achievement Award.

MEET OUR FLUTE CHOIR READING SESSION DIRECTORS AND FLUTE CHOIR SHOWCASE WORKSHOP PRESENTERS

Kim Lee is a freelance flutist and flute teacher in the greater Twin Cities area. She has a Bachelor's degree in Fine Arts Flute Performance from the University of Wisconsin Milwaukee where she studied with Robert Goodberg. While at UW-Milwaukee she was also privileged to participate in master classes with Julius Baker and Donald Peck. Kim has played in community bands and other ensembles in the Twin Cities area for the past eighteen years. She is currently a performing member in the Encore Wind Ensemble. Her musical roots are in the Twin Cities Metropolitan area having studied flute privately with Judith Ranheim. As a youth, she participated in Thursday Musical and Schubert Club competitions and also played with the Minnesota Youth Symphony for two years. Kim particularly enjoys playing flute choir literature and has been proactive in coordinating flute choirs as part of her studio teaching. Kim is a member of the National Flute Association as well as the Upper Midwest Flute Association. She and her husband reside in Eden Prairie with their two young daughters. Kim enjoys activities with her family and her hobbies of baking, gardening and reading.



Michelle Grondin is a student at the University of Minnesota, working on her Bachelor of Music in Performance. She is studying flute with Immanuel Davis and conducting with Jerry Luckhardt. Michelle held the position of Chamber Music Coach for the U of MN University Band, which included conducting a flute choir and woodwind choir. Michelle began her flute studies at the age of five with her father, James Grondin, and continued her studies with Leslie Short, David Gerry, and Anne Marie Dawson. Michelle has played in master classes for Bradley Garner, Tadeo Coelho, Keith Underwood, Sandra Church, Gary Schocker, and Trudy Kane. Michelle participated in the 2006 and 2007 NFA National High School Flute Choir on flute, piccolo, alto flute and bass flute. She also performed with the ASTA 2008 National High School Honors Orchestra and the 2008 Indiana All State Orchestra. Michelle twice won the Wind Division of the South Bend Symphony Young Artist Competition, awarding her a performance of the Vivaldi Piccolo Concerto K433 with the symphony in March 2006. An avid chamber musician, Michelle won the Fischhoff National Chamber Music Association's 2008 Kenneth Geoffroy Memorial Award as a member of the Zenith Quartet.

Dave Mendenhall received his undergraduate and graduate degrees from the University of Minnesota. He has spent the last 33 years as a music educator in Apple Valley, MN. He was director of bands at Scott Highland Middle School for 28 years before retiring in 2010. His school jazz ensembles and bands have played at numerous festivals and conventions (MMEA in 1994), earning outstanding recognition by educators and clinicians alike. As a professional musician, Dave has performed in the Twin Cities corporate and jazz scene playing with national and local musicians. He is currently serves on the JazzMN Orchestra board as the educational chair, works for McNally Smith Music College as an educational outreach liaison, teaches privately and continues to play professionally. Understanding and teaching the 'process of learning' has been the most rewarding part of my career. Helping young students develop life skills through the learning of an instrument, and then making music with others, has been inspirational to me.



Bill Blatzheim has been a Choir Director at Apple Valley High School since 2008. He holds a BA in Vocal Music Education (2007) from St. John's University where he studied vocal pedagogy and choral conducting with Dr. Axel Theimer and Br. Paul Richards. He also currently serves as the Interim Assistant Conductor of the Twin Cities-based choir Kantorei. He is an active solo performer in both voice and jazz piano. Mr. Blatzheim believes that the most expressive singing and music-making occurs when the voice is free to work naturally and without inhibition. Working with voices, therefore, is not simply about addressing the physical action associated with singing, but the physiological and psychological attitudes of the singer and how these approaches interact and affect one another. This approach to music making can be applied not only to singing, but all manner of instrumental performance as well. Mr. Blatzheim is a member of the Minnesota Music Educator's Association/Music Educators National Conference and the American Choral Director's Association of Minnesota.

Elwood "Woody" Johnson is a graduate of the University of Minnesota with a Master of Fine Arts Degree in Choral Conducting. He has studied organ with internationally known Daniel Chorzempa and Gerald Bales and has played or conducted choirs in many local churches for over 50 years. He is currently principal organist at Wooddale Church in Eden Prairie, MN. Woody is a well-known music educator throughout the state of Minnesota and has gained a reputation as an energetic choral clinician. The honor of Minnesota Choral Director of the Year was bestowed upon him in 1988 by the American Choral Directors Association. He has 14 choral compositions and arrangements in print and is the author of the textbook, "WHAT IS ROCK?" and also has written the music for a full-length musical melodrama "DRACULA: A PAIN IN THE NECK. He is a former Music Coordinator of the Minneapolis Public School system and taught choral and instrumental music there for 30 years. He has previously taught music courses here at Northwestern College in addition to directing women's choirs at Fairview Lutheran Deaconess and University of Minnesota Schools of Nursing. Woody just retired after having taught choral and instrumental music at Southwest Christian High School in Chaska for the past 12 years, but continues his musical endeavors by conducting the Twin Cities Master's Chorale.
