What a privilege this is!

In this newsletter, we are using the former, verbal type of communication to convey facts and details to you concerning the latter, more profound, non-verbal means of communication. We look forward to experiencing both types of communication with all who are able to join us on April 9 at Flute Fest 2016!

## Laudie Porter Memorial Competition, 2016

Laudie Porter (1935 - 1986) was a founding member and the first president of the Upper Mid-west Flute Association. Born in North Carolina, Ms. Porter received her B.A. from Swarthmore College and her M.A. from Radcliffe. She studied with William Kincaid of the Philadelphia Orchestra, Frans Vester, Trevor Wye and Marcel Moyse.

Ms. Porter was on the faculty of Carleton College from 1968 to 1985. During her time at Carleton, she researched and performed many programs, including British women composers, American music, and a concert devoted to the flute in mythology. She appeared frequently in concert with her husband, keyboardist David Porter, and her four children, all of whom are musicians.

Laudie Porter was a driving force in forming UMFA. When serving as president from 1979-1981, Ms. Porter's inspiration, optimism, and persistent energy served as a catalyst in developing communication and camaraderie with Minnesota flutists. Her efforts put into motion many inventive programs and presentations that still exist today.

The Laudie Porter Memorial Flute Scholarship Competition was established in 1987 to honor Ms. Porter's generosity, warmth, compassion, and zest for learning, as well as her devotion to music, the flute, and the flute community.

This year we will host the Preliminary round of the Laudie Porter Memorial Competition at Lake Harriet United Methodist Church on Saturday, March 19th. The finals are being held at Flute Fest at Plymouth Congregational Church on Saturday, April 9th and are open to the public. Come hear several wonderful young flutists perform standard repertoire for the competition throughout the day!

## Rochester Flute Choir

Rochester Flute Choir, Inc. is a non-profit organization under the auspices of the Rochester Community Band's 501(c)(3) certification. The mission of the Rochester Flute Choir is to provide quality live chamber music to the citizens of Southeastern Minnesota for the purpose of educating listeners and performers about styles and historical back-grounds of the works being performed as well as the instruments in the flute family.

The flute choir was founded by Linn Kezer in October 2012 when she moved to Rochester and learned there was no flute choir in town. Ms. Kezer had played in flute choirs previously and hoped to continue this experience in Rochester. The group began with four people and has grown to fourteen members.

The Rochester Flute Choir has played over 30 performances in many venues, including area schools, church services, private parties, craft fairs, community band concerts and festivals, fundraising events, garden tours, and more.

The members have a wide range of backgrounds, abilities, and ages. Membership in the ensemble is open to high school and adult flutists of any skill level. No audition is required.

Rehearsals are held every Wednesday at 7:30pm until 9:00pm, September through May, at St Luke's Episcopal Church in Rochester, MN. Interested flutists can contact the flute choir ([rfc.flutes@gmail.com](mailto:rfc.flutes@gmail.com)) or simply show up at a rehearsal with a flute and a music stand.

The flute choir is currently seeking a new Artistic Director. There are several volunteer opportunities, which can be filled by flute choir members or non-members, including Webmaster, Photographer, Videographer, Graphic Artist, and Concert Coordinator.

# My Journey with the Upright Flute Head Joint

A number of years ago, I was unable to play my flute without severe pain in my upper left back muscles. I saw Dr. Jennine Speier, doctor of physical medicine, whose specialty is with musicians' injuries and went to the physical therapist she recommended, Julie Liebelt, who also works with musicians. Julie had me play my flute for her to determine just where and when the pain returned. After therapy, I felt better for a time, but finally I stopped playing my flute altogether.

I learned that UMFA member, Betty Braunstein, wore an Alignment shirt for her back problems. I contacted Betty and also sent for a shirt. It helped some of my discomfort, but I still was unable to play my flute without pain. During our correspondence, Betty and I discovered we saw the same doctor and physical therapist and remained in contact.

My teacher, Nancy Maloney, e-mailed me that she had heard that Sanford (Sandy) Drellinger in New York made an upright flute head joint. I contacted him and eventually made an appointment to meet him at his home in White Plains, New York, just outside of New York City.

My husband and I flew to New York City. We took the train out to White Plains, and Sandy met us at the station. He had me play my flute, took measurements, made many notations, and had me try several different head joints. He told me that he had made four versions of the upright head joint, each time redesigning it to make it more user-friendly.

I waited impatiently for three months, and my upright head joint in a newly designed case and instructions arrived in April. I managed to get all the parts together

and play some simple scales and songs.

At first, I played sitting down, with the special tip to hold it on my knee as he had suggested. That worked well for awhile until I discovered that I could only read a single page of music. Turning my head, of course, changed my embouchure.

Sandy had shown me how to stand and play with a neckpiece, but that caused neck strain.

Nancy and I have tried many things since then, such as placing the end of my flute on a stand separate from my music stand. That worked somewhat, but I still had to turn my head for that second page.

Next I tried to hold the flute without the neck strap. That worked okay, but I was unable to play C#. Although Sandy had placed velcro on my flute to hold various parts, I thought maybe more velcro would give me more stability. I bought a saxophone part to attach to the velcro. That didn't work either.

Then, one day as I was putting away my flute, I discovered a black object in my case. I looked at Sandy's instructions and recalled that it fit on my flute. I tried it, and lo and behold, I could play C#. It also had the hook for my neck strap. After all was said and done, I should have followed Sandy's instructions. After all, he is an engineer and a musician with about forty years of experience making regular and upright flute head joints.

I have rejoined Flute Cocktail and continue with lessons and a lot of practice.
